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Youth Members Logbook

The purpose of the Logbook is to keep a record of their journey as a Youth Member in Scouting, to keep track of what they have completed in the progressive scheme/badge work and gives the space to reflect on their learning.

Guidance on the Logbook:

- There is no standard size for a logbook.
- Each Youth Member is required to maintain a log or record of their journey in scouting, reports of activities, including workings on their progressive scheme and badge work.
- Youth Members can choose to hand write their log or type it on a computer.
- This log can be a book, a file or can also be a blog on an online platform or a digital file.
- The Youth Member can customize their logbook/file as they would like. (What is important that the journey is captured and recorded).
- The log should be maintained and presented in a manner that Leaders can review relevant records of the progressive scheme and badge work that is being carried out by the Youth Member.
- Leaders should encourage Youth Members to log / record the experiences, learnings, and their own workings.
- Information sheets, reference notes can be provided by Leaders to Youth Members however, it should not be encouraged to copy these on to the Youth Members Log. Such material can be filed separately.
- Leaders should take time to review and advice Youth Members on how best and meaningfully they could present the experiences and progressive scheme/badge workings on their log.

The current Progressive Scheme and badge syllabus indicates that “Appropriate notes should be made on the logbook”, this should be interpreted as Youth Members making their research and information gathering – and making summarized notes on their logbook for the purpose. Any additional detailed notes or information can be filed separately.

Youth Members logbook should be a personal record of each member and it should not be encouraged for parents to make the logbook for the Youth Members.

Among the Youth Members, such logs should be maintained by members of the Cub Scout, Scout and Rover Scout Section.
