

BASIC UNIT LEADERS TRAINING COURSE - PRE-CUB SECTION INFORMATION SHEET



The Basic Unit Leaders Training Course for Pre-Cub Section is designed to prepare adult volunteers to deliver the Youth Programme for the Pre-Cub Section of the Scout Association of Maldives. This is the youngest age section offered by the Association; 5 to 8-year-olds. The Course aims provide understanding and methods necessary to run effective activities for the section.

The training will cover the following key aspects; Safe Scouting (Safe from Harm), Fundamentals of Scouting, Youth Programme, Pre-Cub Activity planning, Role of a Unit Leader, how to run Colony Meetings (including ceremonies), Scouting organization and other key elements to effectively run a Pre-Cub Colony.

The course is designed in a more learner-centric model of acquiring knowledge of scouting leadership. It enables participants to extract the most information in a given period of flexible time, to present the information in their own ideas, and to apply that information in practical areas.

Eligibility Requirement: Commitment to work as an Adult Member of the Scout Association of Maldives and function as an Adult Leader in a Registered Scout Group.

Course modality

This course is split into two parts:

1. On-Demand Learning: duration of 1 month



Participants will have to register for this part via an online form. In this phase participants will be given access to course content settled in Canvas LMS. This content will contain reading materials, and choice quiz assignments. This part is completed individually so all submission should be their own work. The Course Director will guide participants through this process. Module facilitators will also be available if participants have questions based on information in given modules.

2. Discussions: 1 day (tentative)

Participants who successfully complete all modules in Self-learning phase will be allowed to register for discussion sessions via an online form. This part will focus on participant discussions and presentations to key areas and questions of the respective module to generate ideas of effective program delivery and basic problem-solving. These sessions can be held via face-to-face with joint groups, or virtually.

3. Assignment

Participants will be required to submit an assignment in order to complete the course.

A detailed course schedule will be provided to participants. Once participants complete all three parts of the course, the completion certificate will be issued to them.
